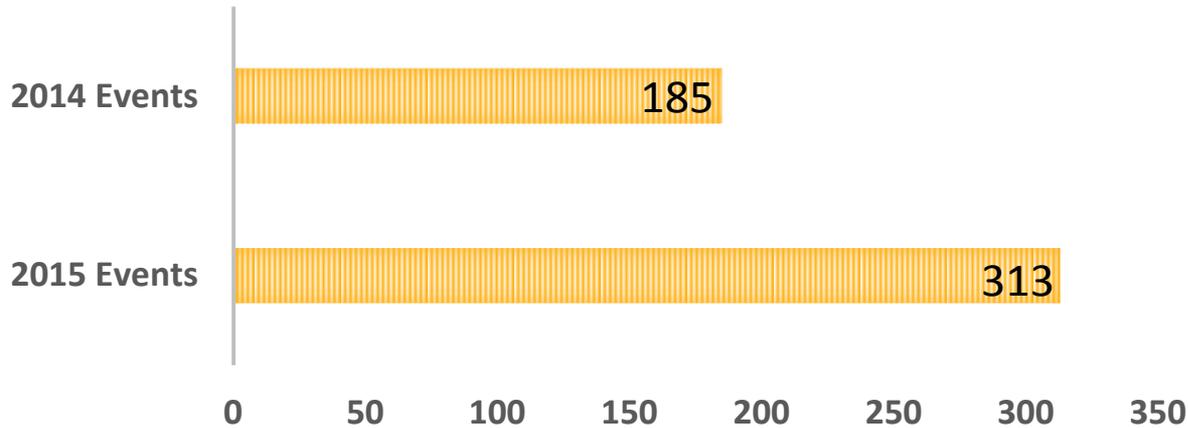

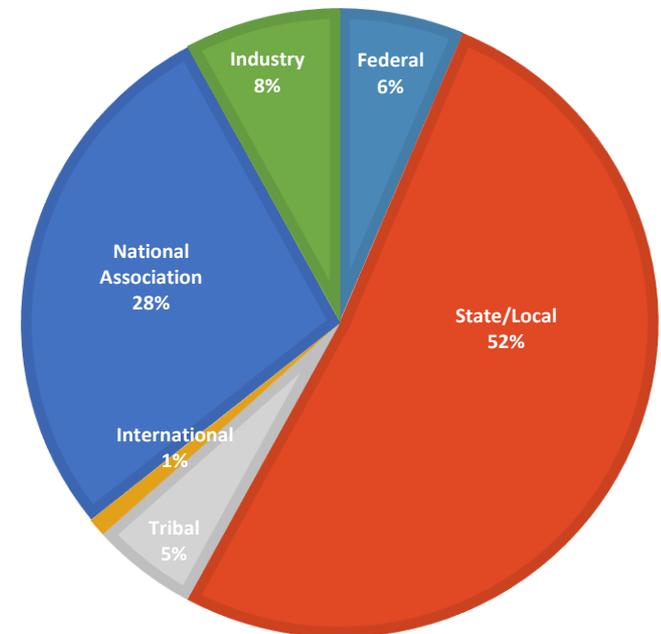

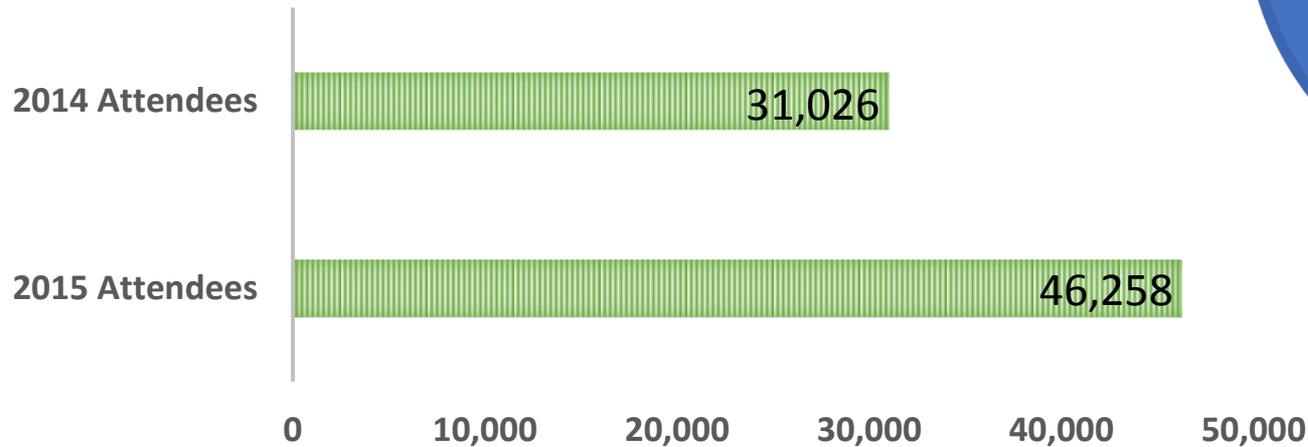
## EVENTS COUNT

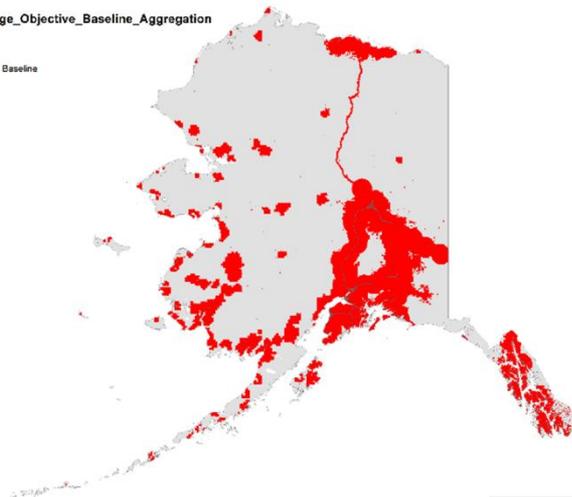
**Colorado Coverage Objective**



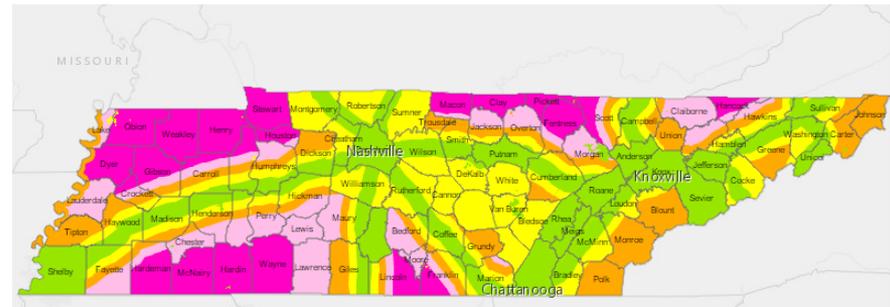

# FirstNet Spectrum – Band 14



## 20 MHz of Spectrum @ 700MHz

- 3GPP standardized as LTE “Band 14” 10 MHz Downlink + 10 MHz Uplink
- Spectrum licensed to FirstNet from the **FCC** under call sign “WQQE234”
- Governed by **PART 90** rules “Private Land Mobile Radio Services” not Part 27 which governs commercial cellular in other bands
  - Allows higher power portable/mobile devices – benefit to rural
  - 3GPP Standards already in place for 1.25W devices

  - Optimization and project closeout continues. The team is focusing on engaging federal users and sustainability

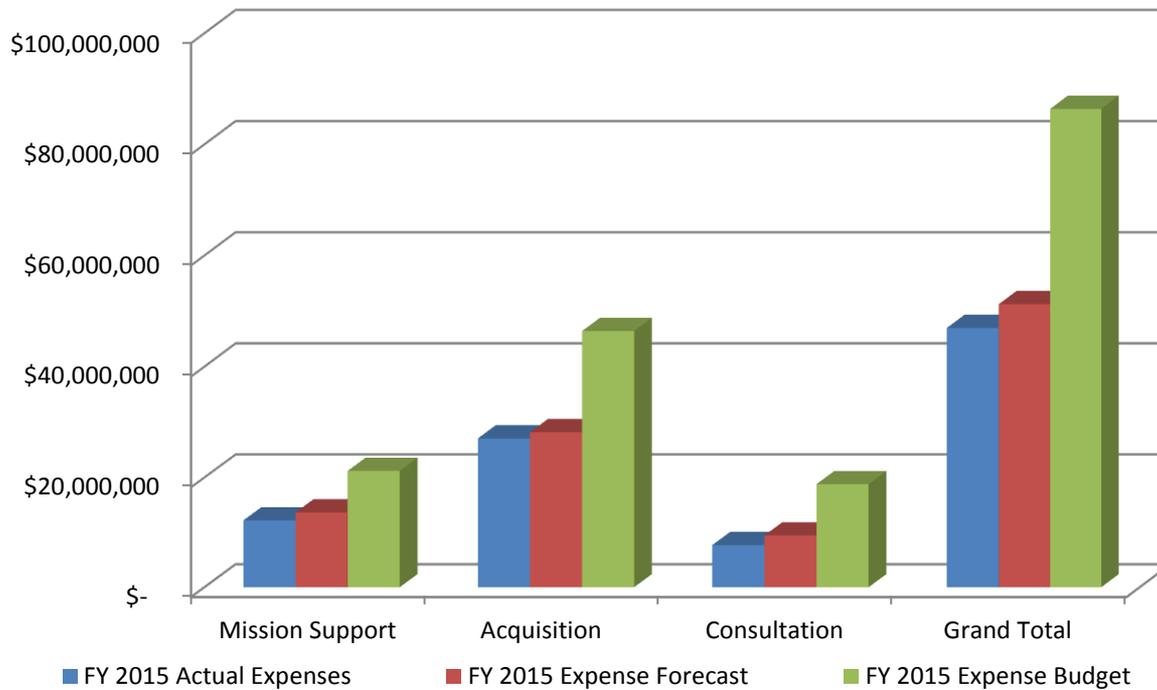
