Effects of strategy on user adoption and financial sustainability



- Low prices tied to premium services will strain FirstNet's sustainability






- Many responses recommended significant customer care and marketing
- Enlist state and local engagement in pre- and post- sales and leverage learnings from early adopters
- Provide customer marketing and education
- Supplement in-person marketing with strong web-based tools to provide seamless customer experience
- Leverage existing vendor sales forces
- FirstNet must conduct significant Public Safety engagement to inform the community of the network's existence and unique value proposition.
- FirstNet must continue to engage and consult with the first responder community throughout deployment and during operation to understand and meet the needs of all public safety users.
- FirstNet should encourage device manufacturers to incorporate Band 14 compatibility into all commercial devices.
- FirstNet should consider leveraging local control to best meet disparate public safety needs




- Define deployment milestones to maximize adoption by public safety

- States recommended balanced plan to ensure timely rural and tribal coverage
- One suggested a separate industry outreach to reach consensus on IOC(s)/FOC


Priority and Preemption



- States described existing governance structures that can be used for local control of priority and preemption
- Respondents encouraged FirstNet to develop standards on preemption and how dynamic allocation of priority will be implemented
- Will require regional governance with multiple agencies' competing interests
- Local control must be clearly defined
- One integrator described the difficulties in implementing dynamic priority and preemption in a crisis
