



WHAT IS THE PUBLIC SAFETY ADVISORY COMMITTEE (PSAC)?

The [First Responder Network Authority \(FirstNet Authority\)](#) is an independent authority within the U.S. Department of Commerce’s National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) tasked with ensuring the establishment of a nationwide, interoperable public safety broadband network. In executing this mission, the FirstNet Authority seeks to create a dedicated and differentiated broadband communications experience that transforms public safety operations. The FirstNet Authority’s [Public Safety Advisory Committee \(PSAC\)](#) provides advice and recommendations to assist the FirstNet Authority in carrying out its statutory duties and responsibilities. The current PSAC is comprised of over 40 representatives from public safety associations, and local, state, tribal, and federal government. The PSAC is led by a 5-member Executive Committee and a PSAC Chair.

The PSAC is a leading voice of public safety subject matter expertise, and executes its advisory role by assembling various teams and working groups, and hosting regular webinars, on the technical and operational features related to the FirstNet network. With the support of the FirstNet Authority’s advocacy and technical staff, the PSAC provides direct and real-time feedback and input to FirstNet Authority work, including its [Roadmap](#). The PSAC also employs Strike Teams — efforts designed to quickly capture time-sensitive and topic-specific inputs from PSAC members and operational and technical experts from member associations. PSAC members are critical partners in assisting FirstNet Authority outreach and education efforts across the country with public safety associations.



Additionally, a standing Tribal Working Group (TWG) provides the FirstNet Authority advice on tribal outreach, education, and tribal consultation. The TWG is led by the PSAC’s tribal representative from the National Congress of American Indians (NCAI), and is comprised of representatives from a broad cross section of multi-tribal organizations. The TWG also works to enhance participation by tribal jurisdictions in the FirstNet network, and provide input to the FirstNet Authority’s [Tribal Consultation Policy](#). Disaster Response: Discussed successful past planned and unplanned deployment efforts of FirstNet technologies and future developments



Experience Center: Provided feedback on the direction, purpose, execution, activities, and design of the physical space of the FirstNet Experience Program



Mission Critical Video: Reviewed definitions and current standards around the use of mission critical video on the FirstNet network



FirstNet Authority Roadmap: Collaborated on initial [FirstNet Authority Roadmap](#) priorities and domains, utilizing their operational and technical experiences



Standards: Discussed the FirstNet Authority's work with standards governance bodies via their network engineers



Telehealth: Learned about upcoming telehealth capabilities and tools on the FirstNet network, and utilized this information to finalize [considerations for EMS leadership](#) in implementation of these capabilities in the future

App Catalog: Provided detailed feedback regarding the development of the FirstNet App Catalog, including training, content, and security



Internet of Life Saving Things (IoLST): Participated in live polling on public safety IoLST needs, and provided feedback on location tracking, voice-to-text, traffic control, telemedicine, smart devices, and fleet management



Location Based Services (LBS): Offered comprehensive feedback on the operational needs for vertical and horizontal accuracy, map rendering, z-axis measures, Wi-Fi use, and deployables



Mission Critical Push-To-Talk (MCPTT): Validated public safety MCPTT survey results, and provided feedback on devices, applications, accessories, and ecosystem features



Network Status Tool: Provided feedback on network alerts and notifications, alert delivery method, search functionality, data granularity, and 'real-time' outage information



Quality of Service, Priority, and Preemption (QPP): Received details on priority assignment overview, and provided feedback on QPP policies, procedures, and messaging
